

EXPLORE THE FLORA AND FAUNA

There is a wealth of nature all around the cottage.

There are natural gardens surrounding the house with secret places to hide-away with a warm blanket and a good book. The back garden includes an underground waterway that goes through the property. In the springtime, the property is scattered with azaleas, hydrangeas, nasturiums, wild daises and wild berries ready for your picking.

In the towering forrest are tall Mahoe trees which make it a perfectly protected area. Pathways dissect the landscape taking you to natural springs which are the source of water, as well as to deeper woods where you will likely encounter most of Jamaica's indigenous birds and many migrants during the winter months.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND?

An area of outstanding natural beauty, ideal for walking and biking. Spectacular views of close-by mountain ranges take your breath away.

Guided bird walks can be arranged on request.

There are wonderful walking opportunities all over the area and Hollywell Forest Reserve is a centre for some particularly beautiful walks.

Cinchona Botanical gardens, one of the highest botanical gardens in the world(5200 ft) was established in 1868 to grow cinchona trees for the manufacture of quinine. Now in semi-abandoned condition, there is a wonderful collection of trees and flowering shrubs from all over the world.

The Blue Mountain peak which is the highest point of the island, rises 7402 ft. and is a popular hike for visitors to the island.

Newcastle Military Camp was built by the British in 1841 for the troops to escape the yellow fever spreading in the Kingston plains, the camp is still in use today by the Jamaican Defense Force. You can walk through the old wooden barracks and, from the parade ground, enjoy an amazing view of the Blue Mountains, Kingston and its bays.
